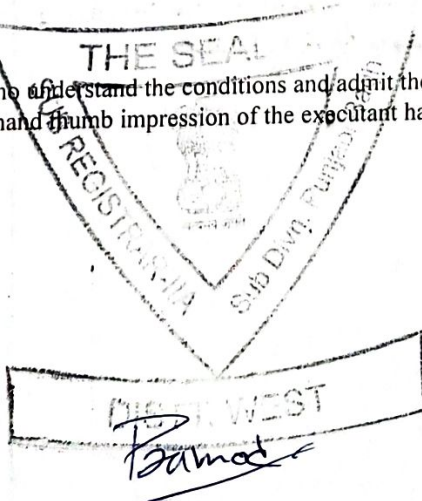

25. To established /run / manage hospital, health center, mobile health clinic, research center to provide health care, counseling and referral services for all kinds of illness and disease.

61. To arrange/ establish and maintain adult education, vocational education, technical education and formal and informal education.
62. To organized and take up health educational and welfare programs for society.
63. To make people to aware of social equality.
64. To promote and educate for logical thinking.
65. To help in top priority to liberal and land less persons and their families.
66. To employ, surgical, medical and pharmaceutical officer, nurse, doctors and attendants and provide and supply to other charitable medical institutions all medical surgical and pharmaceutical appliance vans for transport or patients from homes to hospitals or vice versa.
67. To educate and maintain medical students and nurse and other paramedical personal and way of classes seminars. Lectures, symposiums and workshop etc. in the prevention and treat and to the disease. To provide yoga meditation Activities.
68. To award grant, scholarship, fellowships and similar financial assistance or encouragement for advancement of Research in medical Science, Engineering.
69. To do all such other lawful things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of any of the above objects.

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1. To plan promote undertake and assist programs for agricultural development Animal husbandry, market processing, supply and storage of agricultural products, small scale industry cottage industry, Agro industry providing assistance conduct of survey research study and other activities which will enable man and women for their better living, help them to improve their standard of living.
2. To establish schools, college, technical and other institutions, professional colleges, technical and other institutions for imparting general, academic technical or professional education students at large as under laws and rules in force.

4. TO PROMOTE AND CARRY OUT THE OBJECTIVES:

1. Trust is empowered to apply for and receive grant and contributions both from internal and External Agencies institutions, State and Central Government as the case may be.
2. Trust is empowered to purchase, lease of rent property as and when required to promote and execute the object.
3. The trust empowered to raise loans and such funds from financial institutions and government.
4. The trust may enter into contract or agreement or any other transactions for the purpose of promoting the aims.
5. The trust is empowered to take on lease, license, hire or otherwise, deal with all properties funds and assets, or the trust as the board may deem fit.
6. To appoint, persons representatives, agents on other works on such conditions as may be though necessary by the Trust.

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7. The trust funds acquired or earned shall be solely utilized towards fulfilling of the objects and no portion of it shall be utilized for payments to trustees by way of profit interest or dividends or otherwise. The program and benefits shall be open to all those who need as the case may be.

5. **OBJECTIVES OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC UTILITY:**

1. To carry out the objectives general public utility not involving the carrying on of any activity for profit motive such as to establish run, maintain and develop public halls. Cyclone relief centers, communal roit relief centers, homes for the aged destitute men, women and children, on no loss no profit basis.
2. To dig and construct or aid in making bore wells, reservoirs, tanks.
3. To establish maintain run shelter and medical relief to affected people.
4. To receive assist food clothes and shelters displaced person.
5. To accept foreign contribution on behalf of the trust and utilize such contributions for the purpose of carrying on medical relief to the persons.
6. To import machinery, receive by way of donation from foreign countries equipment's for the purpose of research especially in the field of medical scientific and research foundation.
7. To get necessary exemptions license, registration from the government in order to implement the aforesaid purpose early.

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6. THE TRUST FUNDS:

1. Donation Received
2. Donation received from any public charitable institutions.
3. Donation/assistance received from Government
4. Donation/ assistance received from public.
5. Gifts received from public and institutions.
6. Voluntary contributions made with specific direction to from part of the corpus of the trust.
7. Properties including deposits.
8. The income derived from such property/deposits.
9. Foreign contribution/donation/gift in the form of article currency whether india or foreign security, subject to the provision of foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act 1956 and the Rules framed thereunder.

7.0 .NUMBER OF TRUSTEES, THEIR TERM AND POWER TO CO-OPTION:

The Trust will be managed by a **Board of Trustees** consisting of not less than 2 trustees and not more than 25 trustees. The parties of the Second Part will be First Trustees and they shall automatically form the Board of Trustees.

The **Settlor Trustee** shall be the **any of selected Trustee by The Board of Trustees** and he will hold office for his life time. After the demise or relinquishment of office of the **Trustee** or in the event of the first **Settlor Trustee** failing to nominate his successor in office, the remaining trustees shall elect one of the other Trustees as Trustee.

The term of office of First Trustees shall be for their respective lives. The Board of Trustees shall have the power to increase the total number of Trustees up to the maximum number stated above and fix their term as per provisions contained herein.

Any Trustee, including the Managing Trustee may retire from the Trusteeship hereof by giving two calendar months notice in writing of his or her intention to do so, to the Board of Trustees and after the expiry of the period of notice, the Trustee giving the notice shall ipso facto cease to be a Trustee of these presents.

Any vacancy caused by death of any one of the First Trustees, or any vacancy caused by the resignation of any of the Trustees, may be filled up by co-option by the Board of Trustees.

The Trustees who are not First Settlor Trustee or First Trustees shall hold office for a period of one year from their date of appointment by the Trustees. At the end of this one year period, the Board of Trustees may reappoint them for subsequent term or appoint other persons as Trustees in such a manner that the total number of Trustees does not exceed the approved maximum number of Trustees.

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The Settlor Trustee shall have the power to remove a Trustee suffering from physical or mental disability or if he is accused of misfeasance of trust funds or property or misconduct, after satisfying himself on enquiry and such action of the **Settlor Trustee shall be final**. If a trustee remains absent for three meetings consecutively or leaves India and settles in foreign country, he can be removed.

The proceedings of the Board of Trustees shall not in any way be invalidated due to any post or posts remaining vacant. During the time when a vacancy is yet to be filled up, the remaining Trustees shall act as "**Full Board**", subject to the presence of Quorum in the meetings. Any vacancy in the Board of Trustees or illegality in the appointment of Trustees or their proceedings shall not invalidate any prior act or decision of the Board.

8. TRUST ADMINISTRATION AND POWER TO THE BOARD:

A. The Board of Trustees shall have power to:

1. To administer the Trust, its properties and affairs and do all the things which will fulfill the performance of the objects for which the Trust is established and for this purpose the Board can apply the whole or any part of the Trust property towards the payment of the expenses of the Trust.
2. The income and the properties of the Trust will be solely utilized towards the objects of the Trust and no portion of it will be utilized for payment to the Settler, or Trustees or their relatives by way of salary, allowances, profit, interest, dividend etc.
3. To open one or more bank accounts in schedule banks and operate the same or provide for operation of the said accounts by any two among them authorized on their behalf.
4. To invest the Trust funds in the manner not prohibited by any provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

5. To buy, sell, mortgage, grant, lease, hire or otherwise alienate all or any of the properties of the Trust in its discretion for adequate consideration, so however any sale or alienation of immovable properties of the trust can be done only after obtaining the prior approval of the Commissioner of Income Tax.
6. To execute power of attorney or powers of attorney to any person for the purpose of executing, administering or managing the whole or any part of the Trust for the purpose of all or some among the objects of the Trust.
7. To borrow money with or without security and to repay the same.
8. To receive, collect and enforce recovery of all monies due or payable to the Trust and grant receipts and discharges therefore.
9. To settle, compromise or compound any disputes or refer the same to arbitration or litigation.
10. To receive voluntary contributions from any person or persons from India or outside, after complying with the statutory formalities, by way of donation, gifts or in any other manner and to hold the same upon Trust for the objects set forth herein.
11. To appoint, suspend, dismiss or otherwise deal with the staff required for the administration of the Trust, to frame rules relating to their salaries and other benefits and generally to exercise all powers ancillary and incidental to effectively carry out the objects of the Trust.
12. The Board shall have power to make and rescind rules and regulations for the management and administration of the Trust.
13. No Trustee shall commit any act or breach of Trust of the Trust fund or property or cause any loss to the Trust property or commit fraud in the administration of the Trust fund / property.
14. The Trustees shall hold honorary office and shall not be entitled to any Salary, allowances or perquisites, except for the reimbursement of actual expenses incurred in connection with attending to the Trust matters.

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15. The Board of Trustees will follow the instructions given by any donor who makes substantial contribution towards furtherance of the objects of the Trust, so long as such instructions are not detrimental to the attainment of the objects of the Trust and are in conformity with the provisions of the Income-tax Act, 1961.
16. For the management and administration of the Trust, the Trustees shall elect one amongst themselves for each of the offices of **Settlor Trustee and first Trustee**. The term of office for trustee, shall be for a period of one year from their date of appointment and they may be reelected for further terms. No Trustee including the Settlor Trustee shall hold more than one of the above offices at the same time. The persons holding these offices of Trustee shall be under the administrative guidance and supervision of the Settlor Trustee and will report to him directly.

B. Roles and responsibilities and powers

The Roles, Responsibilities and powers of all these officers is defined below. In addition to these, the Managing Trustee may grant additional roles, responsibilities and powers to any of the Trustees.

SETTLOR TRUSTEE:

1. In addition to discharging normal duties of a trustee, the Settlor Trustee shall preside over meeting of the Board of Trustees. The Trustee is authorized to sign all documents, including bank documents, acknowledgements for the contributions received, and agreements with individuals, Government Institutions and other organizations, on behalf of the Board of Trustees. The Trustee shall have all the residuary powers, not explicitly assigned to any of the other officers in these presents.

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2. The Settlor Trustee is authorized to sign along with the Trustee bank cheques, deposit release vouchers etc. The Settlor Trustee is empowered to remove any Trustee from the Trust and its offices, if he/she finds that his/her activities are not congenial to the activities of the Trust.
3. The Settlor Trustee is responsible for ensuring that the Trust pursues its Objects and for maintaining the dignity of the Trust organization and shall use his/her influence to promote the activities of the Trust.

Trustee:

The Trustee shall discharge the duties of the Settlor Trustee, in the absence of the Settlor Trustee of the Trust and shall have the power and authority delegated and assigned to him/her by the Settlor Trustee.

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES:

1. The Board of Trustees should meet at least once in every calendar quarter and may meet more often when required.
2. The meeting of Board of Trustees shall be convened by the Settlor Trustee and he shall preside over the meetings. In his absence, the Settlor Trustee may authorize the trustee of such meetings. In the event the Settlor Trustee or trustee are not able to attend the meeting already convened, any of the Trustees present in the meeting may elect one amongst themselves to be the trustee of the meeting.
3. One half of the Board of Trustees or a minimum of two trustees, whichever is higher, shall constitute the QUORUM for the Board of Trustee meetings.
4. All decisions shall be carried out by the majority decision of the Board but in the event of equality of votes, the trustee presiding over the meeting shall have a casting vote.

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5. Any resolution in writing signed by all the Trustees by circulation shall have equal force as though it has been passed at a meeting of the Board of Trustees.
6. The meeting of the Board shall be conveyed after giving at least a week's notice unless all the Trustees agree to accept a shorter notice.
7. The Board of Trustees may invite other persons interested in the objects and functioning of the Trust to attend the meetings of the Board, but they shall not be entitled vote in the meetings of the Board.

VII. BANK ACCOUNT:

Bank Account shall be operated jointly by any two trustees, authorized by the board of Trustees, or any other person, authorize by the board, by a resolution. One or more Bank Accounts may be opened in any scheduled Bank and or Banks in the name of the Trust.

VIII. INVESTMENT OF TRUST FUNDS:

- a. The Board of Trustees shall have the power to invest the funds, assets and properties of the Trust at their discretion in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
- b. The Board shall also determine from time to time, the amount it shall spend on the various activities of the Trust.

IX. ACCOUNTS AND AUDIT:

- a. The financial year of the Trust shall be from 1st April to 31st March of the following year, unless otherwise decided by the Board of Trustees.
- b. The Board of Trustees shall maintain true and fair accounts of the Trust.

- c. The accounts of the Trust shall be annually audited by a Chartered Accountant appointed by the Board of Trustees and the audited statement of account shall be placed before the Board for its approval within three months of the close of the financial year.

X. AMENDMENTS:

While this Trust shall be irrevocable, the Board of Trustees may amend any of the clauses except those relating to objects of the Trust, the settlor Trustee and First Trustees, at a duly convened meeting of the Board with at least 2 weeks' notice, and by a resolution passed by atleast three-fourths majority of the Board of Trustees present and voting. The amendments to the Trust deed can only be passed by a resolution of the Board of Trustees in an actual meeting and not by circulation.

XI. INDEMNITY:

The Board of Trustees shall be indemnified for any act done by them in good faith in the course of the administration of the Trust.

XII. SETTLOR AND THEIR RELATIVES:

Notwithstanding the powers vested with the Trustees under the proceeding clause, no part of the income of the Trust shall benefit directly or indirectly the trustees and no part of the income of the property of the Trust shall be used or applied directly or indirectly for the benefit of:

Settlor Trustee, or any person who makes a substantial contribution to the Trust or of any relative of the **SETTLOR Trustee, Trustees** or the person who makes a substantial contribution.

Any "**related concern**" in which any of the above persons has substantial interest.

For the purpose of this clause, the word "**relative**" and the phrases "**related concern**", "**substantial interest**" and "**substantial contribution**" shall have the meanings assigned to them in the Income Tax Act, 1961.

XIII. APPLICABILITY OF TRUST ACT:

The provisions of the Indian Trust Act 1882 shall apply to all matters not specifically mentioned in these presents.

XIV. ALLOWANCES TO OFFICE BEARER – TRUSTEES

If at any time any Trustees acts as a whole time office Bearer of the Trust or renders any special services, the Board of Trustees may in their discretion pay reasonable remuneration or allowances as they may think proper.

XV. APPLICATION OF INCOME TAX ACT:

All clauses herein are intended to secure exemption from Income Tax on the income of contributions and donations to the Trust and any clause or portion of this Deed of Trust which is inconsistent with or repugnant to the sections of the Income Tax Act, 1961 as amended, substituted or modified from time to time, shall be deemed to be deleted or modified with effect from the date on which the sections to which the clause or part of a clause is repugnant or inconsistent comes into force.

XVI. THIS TRUST IS DECLARED IRREVOCABLE:

XVII. DISSOLUTION:

In the event of dissolution of the Trust, the entire Trust funds shall be realized and first be used for payment of liabilities of the Trust. The assets left if any, shall be disbursed to other Trusts or Associations having similar objectives after obtaining previous approval of Commissioner of Income-tax and in no event it shall be distributed in any manner, to any of the Board of Trustees or their relatives or related concerns.

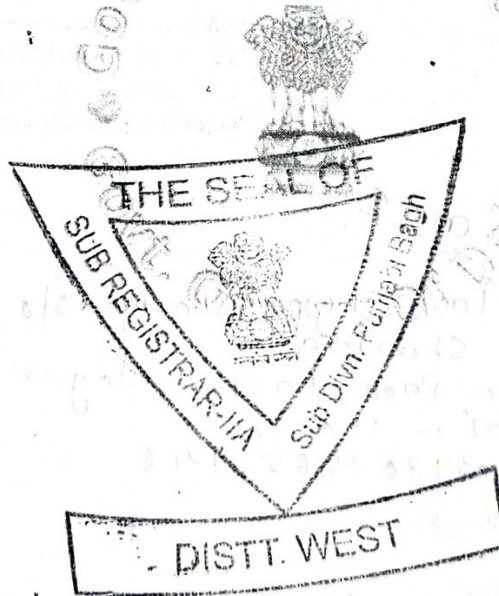

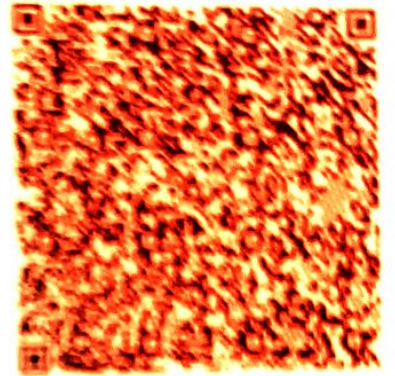
